Matthew 28:16-20 The Message

Meanwhile, the eleven disciples were on their way to Galilee, headed for the mountain lesus had set for their reunion. The moment they saw him they worshiped him. Some, though, held back, not sure about worship, about risking themselves totally.

Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age."

Budget Meeting Nov. 10:

A new Constitution was presented Sunday, September 15th at a business meeting. A motion was made that Council address the issue – whether Gift Discernment Team should be appointed or elected. The Council is recommending the following change:

Page 7 – Gifts Discernment Team

- Purpose and Ministry
 - The Gifts Discernment Team prayerfully discerns and recommends candidates for the various positions needed for the life and mission of the church.
 - The Gifts Discernment Team shall be three elected members serving 3-year, staggered terms.

We also discussed membership. The Council recommends the following change:

Page 8 - remove numbers in parentheses – (#1-3) in #4.

Our next step is to vote on the Constitution. We need to hold this vote in a timely manner so that we can lay plans for 2014.

Next Sunday – September 29th – will have a brief business meeting after church to vote on the new Constitution, with the above changes, presented last Sunday. We will move to the basement immediately after church to conduct this brief meeting.

Upon congregational approval, our new Constitution will take affect at the Annual Business Meeting, January 2014.
